Phase 1A

- Long-term care facility residents
- Healthcare personnel
- Persons potentially exposed to infectious material that can transmit disease among or from healthcare personnel and patients
- Persons ages 65 and older
- Persons ages 16-64 with high-risk conditions

Phase 1B

- People in congregate settings not otherwise specified as long-term care facilities
- Persons receiving home and community-based services
- First responders
- Correction officers and other workers serving people in congregate care settings not included in Phase 1A
- Food and agricultural workers
- US Postal Service workers
- Manufacturing workers
- Grocery store workers
- Education workers
- Clergy and other essential support for houses of worship
- Public transit workers
- Individuals caring for children or adults in early childhood and adult day programs

Phase 1C

- Transportation and logistics
- Water and wastewater
- Food service
- Housing construction
- Finance, including bank tellers
- Information technology
- Communications
- Energy, including nuclear reactors
- Legal services
- Federal, state, county, and local government workers
- Media
- Public safety
- Public health workers

Phase 2

Everyone ages 16 and older not previously covered

How do I sign up for Allegheny Alerts?

- Visit http://alleghenycounty.us/alerts
- Sign in if you already have an account OR select Sign Up in blue at the bottom of the white square.
- Create a username and password, input your name, and select a Security Question. Hit the large blue button at the bottom of the screen labeled "Create Your Account"
- This will take you to a page to select your Time Zone and select how you are notified. The
 options of notification are: email, text message, phone call, or TTY. Ensure you provide the
 phone number or email address of your preferred mode of notification.
- Move your preferred mode of notification to Number 1 spot using the small red arrows to the left of the mode of contact. You can select multiple methods of notification and rank them.
- Input your location(s) to be informed of events occurring in your area. You can add multiple (example: home, work, school, family member home, etc)
- Select the alerts you would like to subscribe to. Each gray bar provides a drop down menu of sub-alerts. If you select the white checkbox on the gray bar, you will subscribe to all sub-alerts in that menu. For example, under "COVID-19 UPDATES" you can choose to subscribe to "Information from Allegheny County" and "COVID-19 Vaccination Information."
- Once completed, review the information you put into your account to ensure it is accurate
- If you have a smartphone, you can download the mobile app titled "Everbridge" for the alerts as well.
